Our Board of Education was very proud to recognize a number of students for their outstanding efforts and achievements.

First, we congratulated J.P. Case Middle School student Thomas Gonzalez. Thomas qualified to advance to the National History Bee Championship in Atlanta. He competed on June 1. We are so very proud of Thomas. Thomas received a certificate of recognition.

Next, honored students who performed well in the annual New Jersey Math League. In 6th-grade, Reading-Fleming Intermediate School ranked 1st in our region and 17th in the state out of 148 schools. The following students received a certificate for achieving a high score in the competition: Aidan Lynott, David Pellitta, Austin Preiss, Natalie Riebe, Brandon Rodriguez, Elijah Teague and Sam Winiarski.

In 7th-grade, J.P. Case Middle School ranked 1st in our region and 12th in the state out of 151 schools. The following students received a certificate for achieving a high score in the competition: Molly Chakraborty, Kailash Raman and Rishubh Thaper.

In 8th grade, J.P. Case Middle School ranked 1st in our region and 21st in the state out of 151 schools. We especially honored Srinivasa Cheekati, who ranked 10th among the top 28 students in the state. Srinivasa received a certificate.

We also gave certificates to high scoring students Emily Molter and Andrew Custy. We congratulated all of these students for their math achievement and their math teachers for their success and achievement.

We also honored another group of students for their math success. Once again, students in our district performed well in the Continental Math League competition. In 3rd-grade, our district was one of four that placed 1st nationally out of 378 schools. In 4th-grade, our district was one of four districts to place 1st nationally out of 313 schools. The following students achieved perfect scores at each team meet and received a medal and certificate: Noah Miller, 3rd-grade, Copper Hill; Natalie Mayrides, 3rd-grade, Copper Hill; Daniel McCarthy, 4th-grade, Copper Hill; and Rebecca Bozzo, 5th-grade, Reading-Fleming Intermediate School. We are so proud of all of our budding mathematicians! We also celebrated and thanked the math teachers who work with these students for their outstanding efforts. We congratulated all.

Finally, we honored a group of young leaders who have been working to tutor students at Barley Sheaf School this year. The following students received a certificate honoring their efforts. Girl Scout members Kayla Coleman, Ivy Davis and Caitlyn Adams created the Beary Helpful Tutoring Club in their efforts to earn a Silver Award. They were joined by Girl Scouts Allison Loss and Nicolette Chemerynski as well as Megan Gabruk, Hannah Davis, Jessica Reilly, Kalinda Dooley, Emily Ydoate, Ciara Adams, Tristan Armstrong and Katie Povall. These young ladies worked very hard as diligent tutors throughout the year. We thanked them for their service to our students and their contributions to our district.
