DIRECTIONS: After cutting out the letters above, or by using the letters from the game of Scrabble or Bananagrams to spell the four teeth types (**CUSPID**, **BICUSPID**, **INCISOR**, **MOLAR**) make a crossword puzzle connecting all four words. As you make the puzzle, rub your tongue over the teeth you are spelling and think about the jobs and kinds of food you eat with those teeth.

THE TEETH:

Look in your dental packet for the picture of where the teeth are located.

Incisors – front teeth that cut food apart (apple, cheese, etc.)

Cuspids – the single-pointed teeth that tear food (meat).

Bicuspids – the teeth behind the cuspids with two points.

Molars – the grinding teeth at the back of the mouth (lettuce).

HELPFUL HINTS:

1. “Cusp” is another name for “point.”
2. A cuspid tooth is also known as a canine tooth.
2. Another word for dog is canine. Ever seen a dog’s pointy teeth?
3. Cows have 24 strong molars to grind their food.
