Ms. Behn asked if the Board gave goal action steps. Dr. Copeland noted not yet, it is underway.

Ms. Markowski noted Governor Christie vetoed the subcontracting bill. There will be a statewide school task force created with the New Jersey School Board Association having a representative on it.

Ms. Behn asked about an update on the communications spreadsheet. Mr. Nolan will start again with the new school year.

#### NEW BUSINESS

The Board discussed the possibility of holding only a standard one meeting a month. The Personnel Committee reviewed and recommends same.

Mr. Comegno clarified that the Superintendent can extend and offer employment but the Board will need to act on this. The Superintendent does have a certain level of authority. Dr. Copeland outlined the first and second weeks are Committee meetings and the third week will be the Public Meeting. This will make things more effective and will start in October. He noted the goal is to be most efficient and we need to be mindful of five committees.

On the motion of Ms. Fallon, seconded by Ms. McGivney, approval was given to approve the change in Board Meeting dates to be one a month, the third Monday of each month, effective with the month of October. The Executive Session will remain at 6:00 p.m. in Room D111 and the Regular Meeting at 7:00 p.m. in the Auditorium of the J.P. Case Middle School.

Mr. Nolan noted he will check with Mr. Shumate. Ms. Voorhees shared that a part was on backorder and will be done by the opening of school.
